Population and Development

India is in the midst of a demographic transition, with fertility rates definitely declining, though not as fast as was expected. In the year 2000, much was made of the fact that as the world's population reached six billion, India's share was a massive one billion. However, demographers have pointed out that there is really no reason to panic. The latest census figures show that India has entered the phase of a declining fertility rate, though the actual decline may be less than what was targeted in the preceding years. India's population policy has been guided by the perception that a growing population is a serious impediment to development efforts. India is a vast country with diverse stages of development experienced by different states. The varying features of growth and change in different states in India are often emphasized in the development discourse. Along with the changing definition of development, many new issues have come up that needs special attention from policy perspective. Development is not simply the growth of GDP, it also entails a wide dimensions ranging from equitable distribution of resources, living with good health, environmental protection. Thus to understand development, we need to see the progress in a holistic aspect encompassing a series of issues that are covered in this short term course.

Accommodation
