**FIFTIETH CONVOCATION
24th May, 2008**

It gives me great pleasure to welcome you all on the occasion of the fiftieth convocation of the International Institute for Population Sciences, (IIPS) Mumbai. The Institute has completed 50 years of its glorious existence last year, and we commemorated the year 2006 as the Golden Jubilee year of the Institute. This is our fiftieth convocation and I am happy to report the activities of the International Institute for Population Sciences, Mumbai for the academic year 2007-2008.

The Institute since its inception in 1956, has been conducting a one-year certificate/diploma course for trainees from various countries in Asia and the Pacific region. The course was funded initially by the UNESCAP and later on by the UNFPA. Over the years, through this course the Institute has helped in the training of personnel from various countries of Asia and the Pacific region and our alumni currently occupy key positions in the field of population, health and development in government departments and universities in these countries and in international organizations. Including this convocation, 2384 students from 42 countries of the world, have been trained at the Institute. Two tables given in Appendix I furnish country-wise and year-wise the number of students who have so far participated in the different teaching programmes of the Institute.

The Institute attained Deemed University status in 1985. As a Deemed University, the Institute started

awarding its own Ph. D. degree since 1986. So far, the Institute has awarded Ph.D. degrees to 158 students, including 11 foreign students. From the academic year 1988-89, the Institute started a one-year degree course leading to the Master of Population Studies (MPS) and so far the Institute has awarded the MPS degree to 328 students. Since 1994-95, the MPS course has also been introduced through correspondence, keeping in view the increasing demand for training in the field of Population Studies. So far 182 students have been awarded MPS degree through correspondence. From the academic year 2002-2003, the Institute has started the degree course in Master of Philosophy (M. Phil.) in Population Studies. So far 149 students have been awarded the M. Phil. degree in Population Studies. The one-year Diploma course in Health Education (DHE) started from August 1987 was renamed during the academic year 2001-2002 as Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE). Until the last academic year, 388 students have been awarded Diploma in Health Promotion Education.

In this academic year, the Institute has initiated a Post Graduate Diploma in Community Healthcare (PGDCH) course and a Diploma in Population Studies (DPS) (Correspondence) course. The courses, viz., DHPE and PGDCH are conducted by the Family Welfare Training and Research Centre (FWTRC), Mumbai which is affiliated to IIPS, Mumbai.

ACTIVITIES OF THE INSTITUTE DURING THE YEAR 2007-2008

I. TEACHING PROGRAMME

Regular courses

During the year 2007-08, the Institute offered the following five regular courses:- (a) Diploma in Population Studies (DPS), (b) Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE), (c) Post Graduate Diploma in Community Healthcare (PGDCH), (d) Master of Population Studies (MPS), and (e) Master of Philosophy in Population Studies (M.Phil.). The courses, (a), (b) and (d) are of one-year duration, the course (c) is of fifteen months duration, and the course (e) is of eighteen months duration. Apart from the above regular courses, the Institute also offers Master of Population Studies (MPS) and Diploma in Population Studies (DPS) through correspondence.

The lists of students enrolled for all courses and those who are to be awarded degrees / diplomas during 2007-08 are given in Appendix II.

a. Diploma in Population Studies (DPS)

The duration of the DPS course is one year, with two semesters. The major emphasis of the diploma course is on imparting technical skills in population analysis and making the students competent in handling and interpreting population data. In the academic year 2007-08 eight students were admitted to the Diploma programme. Of the eight, seven have completed the course successfully. Dr. K.C. Das is the Co-ordinator for the DPS programme.

b. Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE)

This course is of one-year duration. During the current academic year, 23 students were on the roll

in the course of Diploma in Health Promotion Education. The Family Welfare Training and Research Centre (FWTRC), Mumbai, conducts the course under the auspices of IIPS. Dr. S. J. Murthy is the Co-ordinator for the DHPE programme.

c. Post Graduate Diploma in Community Healthcare (PGDCH)

This course is of fifteen months duration. It is a new initiative started during this current academic year. Currently five students are enrolled for this program. The course will be completed by December, 2008. Dr. S. J. Murthy is the Co-ordinator of this programme.

d. Master of Population Studies (MPS)

The duration of this course is one year. Holders of a Master's Degree from recognised universities in the relevant social science subjects are eligible for admission to this course.

During the current academic year, 25 students were admitted to MPS/ M. Phil. course. Twenty students were recipients of a Government of India fellowship. Dr. S. K. Singh is the Co-ordinator for the MPS programme.

e. Master of Philosophy in Population Studies (M. Phil.)

From the academic year 2003-04, a facility has been offered where the students of the MPS course can opt for M. Phil. in population studies after further study for a period of six months and submitting a dissertation. Thus, the total duration of this course is of eighteen months. During the current academic year, sixteen students were admitted to the M. Phil. course. Five of them were recipients of the Government of India fellowship. Three of them were recipients of JRF by the University Grand Commission. Appendix

III (Table C) provides the list of M. Phil. Dissertations. Dr. S.K.Singh is the Co-ordinator for the M. Phil. programme.

f. Master of Population Studies (Correspondence)

This course is of two years duration, although students have the flexibility of completing it in a maximum period of four years. In view of the increasing demand, the MPS correspondence course is also open to students from other ESCAP countries.

During the year 2007-2008, fifteen students have completed all formalities for the award of MPS degree (Correspondence). Prof. R. K. Sinha is the Co-ordinator for the MPS (correspondence) programme.

g. Diploma in Population Studies (DPS) (Correspondence)

In view of the increasing demand, this is a new initiative started during this academic year. This course is of minimum one year duration, although students have the flexibility of completing it in a maximum period of three years. Currently 62 students, including four foreign students, are enrolled for this programme. Prof. R. K. Sinha is the Co-ordinator for the DPS (correspondence) programme.

Seminar papers

Towards the end of the second semester, as a part of DPS/ MPS/ M. Phil. regular course, each student is required to prepare a research paper (for DPS & MPS courses) and a dissertation (for M.Phil. course) under the guidance of a faculty member, present and defend it in a specially organized seminar participated by students (mandatory) and the faculty. These papers/dissertations are later finalised on the basis of discussions in the seminars. The seminar paper constitutes a crucial

part of the teaching programme, as it contributes significantly to the development of the research potential of the students. Appendix III (Table A, B and D) provides the list of the topics of the seminar papers presented by the students during the current academic year.

Awards

A student each from MPS and DPS, whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best in are awarded the Dr. C. Chandrasekaran Gold Medal.

A student from DHPE course is awarded the IIPS Gold Medal for his/her overall performance during the academic year. .

The student, whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best in the MPS (Correspondence) course, is awarded the Dr. K. Srinivasan Gold Medal.

Among the M.Phil students, the thesis adjudged to be the best is awarded the Dr. P.N. Mari Bhat Gold Medal. This award has been initiated since this year in memory of Prof. P.N. Mari Bhat by his parents.

The student whose seminar paper is adjudged to be the best in the MPS/ M. Phil. course is awarded the Dr. J. R. Rele Award.

Four IIPS Silver medals are instituted for those students whose overall performance in their respective courses is second best – MPS, DPS, DHPE and MPS (Correspondence)

Study tour

As an integrated part of the Diploma in Population Studies (DPS) and Master in Population Studies (MPS) courses, students were taken on a study tour to get acquainted with the academic and research activities of various institutions.

The study tour of DPS and MPS students for the current academic year(2007-2008) was undertaken during 15-31 March, 2008. The team left Mumbai for Dehradun on 15th March, 2008. During 17-19 March, the students actively participated in the National conference on "Population, Environment and Development in Uttarakhand" which was being organized by IIPS, Mumbai in Dehradun. They also visited local scenic places like Mussoorie, Haridwar and Rishikesh etc.

The students were in Delhi during 20-25 March, 2008. During this period, they visited Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, National Institute of Health and Family Welfare, Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India, AC Nelson-ORG Research Pvt. Ltd, TNS India, Institute for Economic Growth, UNFPA and Jawaharlal Nehru University and were briefed by the respective organizations about their activities.

The students visited Punjab University, especially the PRC and the Dept. of geography in Chandigarh and were briefed about their activities. They also visited the Centre for Research in Rural and Industrial Development (CRRID) which is an ICSSR funded research organization during 26-27 March, 2008.

The students were taken to Amritsar during 27-29 March, 2008. They visited the Dept. of Urban Planning and the Dept. of Economics in Guru Nanak Dev University.

Each student has submitted a report based on field observations and deliberations of resource persons and officials of the host organizations. The report forms an integral part of the DPS and MPS courses.

Prof. R. B. Bhagat and Dr. K. C. Das accompanied the students as faculty guides.

h. Doctor of Philosophy (Ph. D.) in Population Studies

The Institute has well qualified faculty member to guide students for Ph. D. degrees. Students are admitted to the Ph. D. programme on a highly competitive basis. First, they are short-listed based on their academic record. They are then asked to present their proposed study. Based on their performance in the proposal presentation, students are admitted to the Ph. D. programme. Currently 85 students are registered for the Ph. D programme at the Institute. Of them, 12 are recipients of the Government of India Research Fellowship, 6 are recipients of the UGC Fellowship and 44 are registered without fellowship. Appendix II provides the list of Ph. D. students registered in the Institute.

During the year 2007-2008, four students have submitted their theses and have completed all the requirements for the award of Ph. D degree.

Prof. Sulabha Parasuraman is the Co-ordinator for the Ph. D. programme.

iii. SEMINARS/WORKSHOPS ORGANISED BY IIPS

1. NATIONAL SEMINAR

A National Seminar on "Population, Environment and Development in Uttarakhand" was organised by the Institute during 17 -19 March, 2008 at Dehradun. The Purpose of the Seminar was to sensitize researchers and policy makers about the priority areas in population, health, environment and development and their inter linkages. The Seminar was inaugurated by the Governor of Uttarakhand, Shri B.L. Joshi. The Governor congratulated the organizers for selecting this theme for the seminar and bringing together researchers working on various dimensions in Uttarakhand state. Shri S.K. Das, Additional Director General (Stats.), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India spoke on this occasion and emphasized the importance of this seminar. Shri Keshav Desiraju, IAS, Principal Secretary, Health, Government of Uttarakhand said it was the first time that such a comprehensive seminar was being held in Uttarakhand addressing the demographic and health issues of the state. Prof. S. Lahiri, Officiating Director of IIPS highlighted the contributions of the Institute in the field of population and health research in India. Prof. Sulabha Parasuraman welcomed the dignitaries and participants and Dr. T.V. Sekher proposed vote of thanks. Seventy two

research papers were presented in the seminar. A plenary session focusing on 'development of Uttarakhand' was organized wherein the speakers deliberated on important aspects - Prof. B.K. Joshi (on economic growth), Dr. Ravi Chopra (on environmental dimensions) and Prof. Kamla Gupta (on health and population issues). About 160 participants attended the seminar from various parts of the country. The participants included researchers, NGO activists, government officials and teachers and students from universities. The deliberations of the seminar on various aspects were well covered by the print and electronic media of the State. Prof. Sulabha Parasuraman, Dr. T.V Sekher and Mr. Abhishek Singh were the coordinators of the National Seminar.

The Institute conducts seminars regularly in which the faculty, Ph. D students and other research staff participate. The seminars provide a forum for lively academic debate and exchange of innovative research ideas in social science research. The speakers usually give a talk related to their on-going project work or on topics of special interest. From the year 2006-2007, faculty members going abroad to participate in conferences/seminars are required to present their papers at the faculty-student seminar at the Institute.

As a part of the IIPS faculty-Ph. D students' seminars during the current academic year several scholars from abroad and other Institutes in India delivered lectures at the Institute. Appendix VI provides the list of these distinguished speakers and their lecture topics.

VII. OTHER ACTIVITIES AT THE INSTITUTE

a. World Population Day

The world population day for the year 2007 was observed at the institute on 11th July, 2007. A half day symposium on "Challenges of Urban Development" was organized. The invited

panelists to speak on this occasion were: Mrs. Kalpana Sharma (Ex. Chief Editor 'Hindu', Writer of the book "Discovering Dharavi"); Mr. P.K. Das (Architect, and Activist); Mr. Pankaj Joshi (Architect and Activist); Mrs. Anuja Gulati (UNFPA representative); Prof. Kamla Gupta (Head, Dept. of Migration and Urban Studies). Various aspects of urbanisation in India with a focus on Mumbai were highlighted by each speaker.

Prof. Mari Bhat (then Director, IIPS) inaugurated the symposium. He talked about the importance of observing 11th July as the World Population Day. The symposium evoked discussions related to public transportation in Mumbai, health infrastructure and safety aspects in the city. The panellists talked about safety in public transportation and sub-optimal accessibility to effective low cost healthcare services in Mumbai. The state government's indifferent attitude towards the development of housing was discussed by the panellists. Prof. R.B. Bhagat has organized the symposium.

b. Cultural Activities

Like every year, this year also the institute had celebrated Foundation Day and New Year. Due to the sudden demise of Prof. Mari Bhat on 30th July, the Foundation Day scheduled to be observed on 14th August was postponed. New Year and Foundation day were both celebrated together on 31st December, 2007. Students, teachers, staff members and their family members actively participated in the cultural program and made the program more colourful and enjoyable. The students went on a picnic to Khandala Pune on 8th September, 2007.

Dr. K. C. Das organised the cultural programme.

c. Hindi Week

The Hindi week was observed by the institute during 14-21 September, 2007. On this occasion various programmes and competitions were

organised for the staff and students at the Institute.

d. Hindi Workshop

A Hindi workshop was organised on 19th December, 2007 for the staff of the Institute. The invited speaker for the workshop was Dy. Manager (O.L) Shri. Ramvihar Yadav.

Both the events, Hindi week and workshop were organised by A.R. Nirmal under the guidance of Dr. B. Paswan. A Hindi training programme, Pragya was conducted for the employees of the Institute from January to May, 2008.

Mr. A. R. Nirmal, is the Hindi Officer at the institute.

e. Annual Sports Week

During this academic year, the IIPS Annual Sports Meet was convened between during January 2008 with fanfare. A number of sports activities comprising both indoor and outdoor games were organised. Students, staff and faculty members participated in the event very enthusiastically.

The sports activities were co-ordinated by Dr. H. Lhungdim.

VIII. LIBRARY

The Institute maintains an excellent library with most recent books on population and related topics. There are 77,180 books, 13,108 bound volumes of periodicals and 15,844 reprints in the library. The library receives about 325 Indian as well as foreign journals, of which 175 journals are received by way of subscription and another 150 journals are received by gift/exchange. More than 17,500 journal articles have been indexed and added in the library operation software. The library has books on

different disciplines such as Demography, Statistics, Public Health, Family Planning, Anthropology, Mathematics, Economics, Sociology, Psychology, Health Education, Political Science, Geography, Computer Programming etc. published by the Union Government, State Governments, Corporate Bodies, International Agencies and Commercial Publishers of India as well as abroad. The library is housed in a separate building and consists of a reading hall with a seating capacity of 70 and a conference hall with a seating capacity of 40. The library provides abstract and current awareness services, documentation, reference, inter-library loan and xeroxing facilities. The library has a special collection of all the Census Publications of India & neighbouring countries, indexed journal / edited books' articles and made available through OPAC.

The Institute's library provides bibliographic and reference services to other libraries, organizations and researchers and also fulfils requests for information from libraries outside India.

The library is fully automated with SLIM-21 software and offers online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) through a network of computers. The databases offered are POPLINE, JSTOR, INDIASTAT.COM, PUBMed and NUCSAL. The databases are accessible through all the computers on the campus. To promote the national language, Hindi, a bibliographical database has been made available in Devnagiri script, and is accessible through OPAC. The results can be retrieved even if the query is in English. Digital documents are accessible through a central server on intranet. IIPS library is a member library of INFLIBNET Centre (Information and Library Networking of UGC), Ahmedabad.

Mr. D.D. Mestri (Library & Information Officer) is in charge of the library.

IX COMPUTER CENTRE

A Computer Centre was established in 1986 when the UNFPA provided grants to purchase a VAX 11/780 mini computer. However, with the advent of personal computers, the VAX computer was not very useful and was subsequently sold. In the year 1993, the UNFPA provided hardware in the form of 20 Intel 486 computers, six laser jet printers and two dot matrix printers.

The Centre has two IBM servers to provide LAN services and local intranet email facilities to the 300 computers in the institute. The work of the Administration and Accounts sections has been computerised. The institute has been procuring the latest software such as STATA10, SPSS Version 15, Endnote and Fine Reader. The Institute has also entered into a Campus Agreement with Microsoft where all computers are being equipped with MS Office 2007 and will receive regular updates from Microsoft.

A 512 kbps line is available to provide internet facilities and the network is protected against viruses and SPAM by a firewall. Printing facilities are available with one Laserjet printer, one line printer and a dot matrix printer. A LCD projector is also available. The institute has procured a 4TB Network Attached Storage (NAS) server to enable storage of large volumes of data obtained from various sources.

X DATA CENTRE

The data centre at the Institute acquired data sets of Census of 1991 and 2001, National Family Health Survey 1 & 2, RCH (Round 1) and Demographic Health Surveys (DHS) and National Sample Survey (NSS) data on CD-ROM media, which are distributed to the

researchers. E-book in CD-ROM media containing the full papers of DPS/ MPS/ M.Phil students' seminar has been prepared and six e-books on topics related to reproductive health, child and maternal mortality have also been prepared.

At present, the users are directly accessing resources such as demographic data sets and POPLINE databases which are stored on the server.

The Data Centre manages and maintains websites <http://www.iipsindia.org>, and <http://www.rchindia.org>. During the academic year 2007-2008 the IIPS website has been redesigned and is regularly updated.

Prof. M. Guruswamy is in charge of the Data Centre of the Institute.

XI HOSTEL FACILITY

The teaching and training programmes at the Institute are fully residential. The Institute has two hostels, which are self contained, well furnished and have adequate living and working space. Computers with internet, washing machines, and LCD television are also provided exclusively for student's use in the hostel. There are 24 air-conditioned rooms at par with international standards with television and computers with internet facilities to accommodate international students and guests of the institute. There is a hostel mess run on no loss- no profit basis by a committee consisting of students, hostel staff and hostel warden. Indoor and outdoor sports facilities and a well-equipped gymnasium are also available for the use of students.

Prof. P. Arokiasamy is the Hostel Warden.

XII. PUBLICATIONS

a. IIPS Newsletter

The Institute brings out a quarterly Newsletter, which publishes information about various ongoing activities of the Institute. Two issues covering four numbers of IIPS Newsletters were printed during the academic year 2007-08.

Prof. R. B. Bhagat is the Editor of IIPS Newsletter.

b. IIPS Research Brief

The 'Research Brief Series' is a new initiative by the Institute in 2007 to provide an opportunity to the faculty, Ph.D. students and visiting fellows to quickly disseminate the important findings of their research studies before they are published as a research report or in a scientific journal. Five research briefs were published during the academic year 2007-08.
